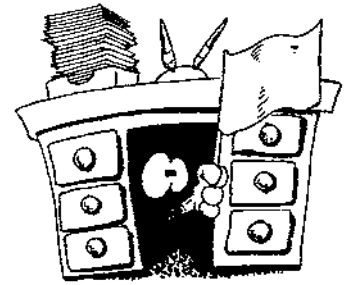

A truly neat guy I work for on that project is a certified car collector and regularly drives a red (naturally) 1958 Alfa Romeo Giulietta Veloce. Thus Richard Weklych's love of fine sports cars led to a middle of the night email from him to me exclaiming that the parking lot of the motel he was staying at in Willows California was filled with Porsches including a black 911 turbo with, of all things, a trailer hitch. "What do you pull with a Turbo?" Guess anything you want!

We made immediate plans to rendezvous in that parking lot at crack of dawn the next morning. Thus begins another adventure in the 'family' of Porsche.

At 6:30 a.m. the parking lot at the Willows Holiday Inn was already buzzing with a symphony of air and water cooled Porsches including the aforementioned black turbo with a perfectly mated trailer hitch. I parked by trusty black VW rental Bug next to it and proceeded to seek out the reason for all this wonderful assortment of machines. The very first person we ran into was the very owner of that trailer totting Turbo: Tom Marinshaw of the Diablo Region. At breakfast he explained that Diablo regularly puts on a DE and this was their day to run at nearby Thunderhill Raceway. He said that these DE's usually bring out about 60 Porsches (Diablo limits their DE events to "P" cars only) but because of the 100 plus degree temps this week (sound familiar?) only about 30 or so were participating in this day's round at the track.

Tom went on to tell the story of the trailer hitch and the retired engineer who designed and makes it (<http://www.willwoodsystem.com/>) and then added those magic words . . . "hey, why don't you and Richard come out to Thunderhill and join us . . . ?"

I looked at Richard . . . I looked at the black VW bug rental . . . and in less time that it takes to dot an 'i' we shifted our work schedule for the day and made tracks that afternoon for Thunderhill.

Then the magic of the 'family' we belong to took over. Upon entering the track and learning I was from the Kentucky Region all doors (including car doors to run on the track) opened up. My phone service was a dud at Willows but Linda and some of her lady friends let me borrow a working cell phone. After my conversation with Ken the ladies wanted to share Richard Collins stories with Ken so they all chatted with him before ending the call. Oh my God . . . what an unexpected reaction. When they put down the phone the ladies literally swooned over Ken's magnificent southern accent saying he was welcome to visit out there with them anytime as long as he brought his wonderful southern speaking style with him! 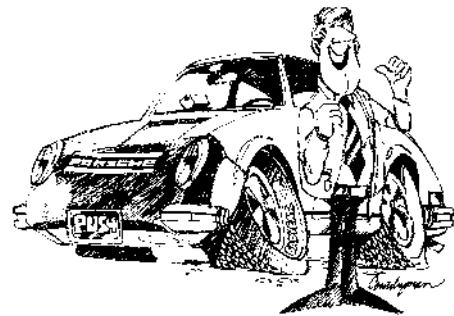

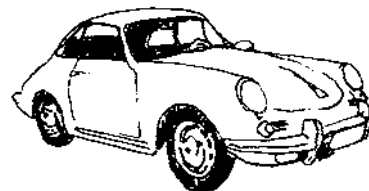
