This is a huge loss to the Porsche community......Richard C





'The Family Porsche' Cleaning Up in Savannah

Parade 2011. Our attendance at this year's gala Parade in Savannah marks the 14th time I've attended, and more than ever, each year seems more like a movable family reunion than a celebration of the Marque . . . although it certainly centers on all things Porsche. Harriet and I joined other Kentucky Region folks in enjoying the City of Savannah's charms and a well organized, fun event (according to the registration Richard and Angela James, Richard Basham and Gary Benton also participated).

This year I had the honor of again serving as a Concours judge and simultaneously we entered our 997 this year. As it turned out we ended up competing in the largest preparation category against 10 other such vehi-

cles from around the county. To make an incredibly short story even shorter: we finished first with the highest raw score and placed second in awards due to the about 200 miles less we drove to the event vs. the eventual winner who drove in from the Potomac Region. Let me underline that those extra points awarded for miles driven to the event are completely deserved since each mile provides opportunities to meet "Mr. Rock Chip" or any of a host of other bad actors lurking on back roads and interstates waiting for the chance to make their mark. Bottom line: we could not be prouder for the opportunity to join with the above members representing the Kentucky Region, and on top of that, winning a silver medal at this level of competition!



Preparing our car took about four solid weekends before we left and another two days after we arrived. This may seem like a lot of time but, as it turned out, it was both a labor of love and learning.

Savannah was as hot as Hades (although Texas still wins for this summer) and the fine folks who ran this year's Concours were well prepared for the blazing sun and molasses-like humidity. All of the Concours participants were afforded a large protected covered wash area and a reserved spot in an air conditioned main exhibit hall in the convention center where almost all of the Parade events, including banquets, were to take place. Cool. And I do mean *cool!* That allowed us to work in a wonderful setting for almost as long as we could go without sleep. And 24 hour security kept our vehicles

under watchful and appreciative eye.

But again this column is about family and that held true for both the Q tip and microfiber cloth wielding clan of cleaners as well as the large number of folks who came by to wish us well and enjoy the broad collection of Porsches from all eras. One example: Richard Brumme, ably assisted by Phil Brengle, and his 1950 356 (the oldest known 356 Cabriolet in the USA). That drop dead gorgeous Adria blue Reutter Cabriolet was featured in the August edition of Panorama. You may have seen previous articles about this car highlighted by Porsche's search for the oldest Porsche in America earlier this year. Also

noted was our own Ken Daugherty's key role in rebuilding the engine and locating parts for it from around the world. A wonderful story in itself! Porsche honored Dick Brumme's stunning 356 and would have been feted as the oldest US Porsche but no paperwork existed proving the car was initially purchased in the USA, which was part of the rules of the search.

Dick and Phil prepared their car right alongside of ours and we shared tips and tales (and my vacuum, his microfiber and Ken Daugherty stories) throughout the two days and nights of prepping and waxing eloquent (sorry!). And that new relationship continued right up to our pre-dawn five mile journey to the Parade Concours site as we used my car for an extra set of brake lights to cover his tail as we drove on the main river bridge and expressway to the site. Pre-A brake lights can be best described as "dim and dimmer."

Dick's car aptly won first in Division as well as the prestigious Zuffenhausen Trophy (second place in the Restoration Group Level of Achievement Award) which represents the best of all cars entered. Wow! What a wonderful stable mate. Dick would have taken it all but for a lack of wheel weights. No kidding. Perhaps no one would have known what they would have looked like, but since all cars of that era came with tires balanced on their wheels the thinking was that wheel weights completed the package. Dick just smiled. He already won the hearts and cameras of everyone else at Parade. Neat guy.

Whether it was Dick's one of a kind or our one of many, entering a Concours at this level proved to be an invaluable personal experience and not for reasons that have anything to do with preparing (code for scrubbing, waxing and detailing with an "electric elbow") our car. The real personal satisfaction for us was the number of new people we met in the process and the great conversations we shared with all the fellow Parade attendees who came by morning, noon, and even midnight to chat. We met new friends like the couple who drove their 911 in from Alaska and old friends like the one 'young' couple, John and Ginny Case, who . . . get this folks . . . not only attended the very first Porsche Parade together 56 years ago; they drove their Boxster across the county from San Diego California to attend this year's Parade. (By the way Porsche NA announced they were honoring them by flying them and several other Parade attendees who have attended 50+ Parades with all expenses paid trips this fall to Stuttgart. Wunderbar.)

Parade . . . whether you compete in the tech quiz, stuff yourself at the banquets, laugh at the instructions in the gimmick rally, drive the speed events, or race RC cars . . . it is a wonderful experience for the whole family.

Next year the Parade will be in Salt Lake City (July 8 – 14, 2012). Hope to see you all there.


