

BlackHawk Farms Raceway

Dear fellow newsletter editors/webmasters in Zone 13, PCA:

The Milwaukee Region still has openings for the May 29 DE day at Blackhawk Farms Raceway. The event features two distinct opportunities. One is the PCA Instructor training course that will prepare experienced DE candidates to serve as an instructor for novice drivers at future DE events. The other opportunity is track time for experienced drivers, open to Run Group 2 (intermediate) and Run Group 3 (advanced) drivers.

The PCA Instructor Training course will be led by a seasoned instructor trainer provided by PCA National. The instructor training course is open to those who have not instructed previously, and to those who have some instruction experience, but no formal training. Regardless, instructor candidates should have significant high-speed driving experience (preferably a minimum of 15 DE events, at least one of which was on the Blackhawk Farms Raceway track).

The day will also feature a DE event for experienced drivers only. No instructors will be provided for this DE event, and is, therefore, open only to Run Group 2 (intermediate), and Run Group 3 (advanced) drivers.



- •Is synthetic oil real oil?
- •Should I spend the extra money in synthetic oil?
- •What's the difference between dino and synthetic?
- •What's the difference

between the different brands of synthetics?Why is one better?... which one?

OK, let's go one at a time.

Is it real oil? The answer is yes and no. Yes, because dino (conventional) oil and synthetic oil both come from the ground. No, because synthetic oil starts out as crude oil which gets pumped out of the ground, then gets distilled, purified and broken down to its basic molecules.

The oil companies do this so that they can remove much more of the impurities from the raw oil and they can also customize the oil molecules to perform at much higher levels of protection and performance than with conventional oil. Because synthetic oil contains less impurities, it keeps your engine cleaner inside. Synthetic oil also resists the formation of oil sludge, a thick, nasty goop formed when motor oil breaks down from prolonged exposure to high heat and stress. Because of


it's consistency and viscosity, sludge does not flow well and therefore does not get into all of

the nook and crannies to protect the engine as it is supposed to do, generating in extreme cases catastrophic engine failure.

Because of it's reengineered molecules and special additives, synthetic oils can also work more efficiently in weather extremes.

Maybe you have noticed how oil change



intervals have been getting longer and longer in the last 10 or 15 years. this is because of what we explained above. There are Porsches where the recommended oil change interval is 15,000 miles, even 20,000!

Although I understand the factory's reasoning and the intent for environmental protection, I recommend to all my customers and do so myself, no more than 5,000 mile intervals.

Most Porsches are driven right around 5,000 miles per year so that's a once-per-year oil change. By changing the oil at that interval it also allows you

to check the oil filter element and see what it caught in its folds.

If you don't change the oil yourself, make sure you ask your tech to save the filter for you. Then closely look in between the filter's paper folds so you can see if it's catching metal particles and flakes that come from no other place than your engine.

In many cases people have been able to avert catastrophic

engine failure by catching it in time through oil filter inspection.

The differences between the different


synthetics, when comparing the same viscosity, is basically just the additives used by each oil company.

According to Ullman's Encyclopedia of Industrial Chemistry, additives in motor oil can comprise up to 5% by weight of the oil.

There are additives for controlling chemical breakdown (detergents, rust inhibitors, antioxidants, and metal deactivators) for viscosity (to maintain fluidity at temperature extremes), for lubricity (friction modifiers, pressure and anti-wear agents), for contaminant control (dipersants, anti-foam, anti-misting).

There are also other additives blended into synthetics for the purpose of conditioning the seals and gaskets., so as you can see it gets really complex.

So, how do you choose? Porsche recommends Mobil1 Synthetic oil for use in all Porsches, but they also publish a



list of approved oils worldwide and if you go to any of the Porsche-related Internet forums and ask which oil is better, you'd think you just started World War III.

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I Get Around—My Day With Insane Mode By Danielle Badler, May 2015 Rocky Mountain's High Gear

Friends, if you're within the sound of my words, you owe it to yourself to, at least, test drive the Tesla Model S. Preferably the all-in, all-zoot version, the P85D.

I did, this week, and I'm here to tell the tale.

Let's start with Insane Mode. You've heard about it. I call it a genius marketing gimmick. What it does is allow for full power. Sport mode, the other option, cuts that in half. I left it on. All the time. And so will you. All 600+ hp and 600+ lb.ft. of torque.

Here's what happened. On my drive, with a friend who admits to knowing nothing about cars riding shotgun, we pulled into a rustic restaurant in the mountains, unfolded ourselves, and this guy just appeared, like from out of nowhere, to assault us with "Isn't it unbelievable?" "Don't you

love it?" "Here's what you do, you go on down the road a bit until you get to the straightaway." Wink wink. It's like you just rewrote the formula for the earth - space continuum. Gravity ceases to be an issue.

And that's not all. Actually by a long shot.

It handles. I had my doubts. I mean, 5000+ pounds? I know! Credit, I guess, the battery packs all ideally located below the floorboards. The aluminum frame and body. And the active air suspension. The steering, which has several settings. I chose sport. And, for an electric system, I had very nice feel.

Then there's regenerative braking. Lift, even going downhill, and the car slows... and either keeps the battery charge unchanged or adds maybe a mile or two to your range.

It's the first car, ever, to get better as time goes on. Think about that. And while you're at it, think about what that fact should do for resale value. Why? Software upgrades. Beamed to you overnight. I asked the Tesla people if the Leaf or the Prius does that. The answer was no, this is a Tesla exclusive.

> They told me the last major upgrade, earlier this year, provided forward collision warning and overtake acceleration. This means that, when you pull out of

Which is what we did.

No launch mode. No levers to flip. No bringing up the revs. Just... punch that electric torque curve!

Now, I used to ride a sport bike that had a quoted 0 to 60 time of 2.8 seconds, versus the Tesla's 3.2 seconds. I've driven the Tesla Runabout. I've driven the Bentley Continental Supersport, with similar power and weight to the P85D. I've watched the You Tube videos of whole families doing just exactly what I was about to do.

I've never experienced stomach compression like this. Painful compression. Coupled with hysterical, hyena-like histrionics.

Did I do it again? You betcha. And, truth be told, I also did it to pass cars. I did it on entrance ramps. I did it climbing hills.

your lane to overtake another car, the car knows and automatically increases your speed.

But that's not all. You also got traffic aware cruise control, which locks in on traffic flow, from however fast you're going on down to 0.

The next upgrade, coming soon, will provide virtually autonomous driving from on-ramp to off-ramp. Set the cruise, and the combination of perimeter warning, side collision warning and lane departure warning will allow the car to track the lines in the road, leading you to your preset destination.

There have been reports from Wall Street, questioning whether Tesla will make its stated production goals this year. I asked about that, and I got read the master plan.

First there was the Roadster, which came with a high price and low range. It was more a proof of concept



vehicle than anything else. Then came the familyfriendly Model S. And next up, later this year, is the Model X, an SUV at a comparable price point. Then, in 2017, comes the Model 3, which will retail for \$35,000 or so, before federal and state tax credits.

I remember writing about the Roadster as a great toy to drive, if your lifestyle fit the car's requirements and limitations. Not so with the Model S. On our jaunt this week, we had a 240 mile range. And charging? Superchargers all over the place. Tesla has gone from 0 to 400 stalls in 2+ years. And if you're in "trip planner" mode, the car tells you where they are.

I was at the auto show in Denver recently, and I happened to study the specs there for a 2015 Porsche Panamera S E-Hybrid. Between the supercharged V6 and the electric motor you got 416 hp and 435 lb.-ft of torque. Throw in typical options like the Premium Package Plus, which adds ParkAssist, Porsche Entry & Drive and Lane Change Assist, and you're looking at an MSRP of \$110,000 and change.

The Tesla I drove is \$87,500. I'm just saying.

So we returned the car to a mall, Park Meadows Mall, where Tesla has a Supercharger station. Where charging gives you 170 miles of range in 30 minutes. For free.

My friend looked at me and we agreed, we'd make frequent visits to the mall, to cop a charge and do some concordant retail therapy.

We then walked back into the showroom, and a woman at the counter took one look at me and pronounced, "aha, you have that Tesla smile!" I couldn't help it. Ear to ear.

Yikes, I'm out of space! And I haven't even mentioned the pilot battery swapping program they're running in California, or the resale value guarantee program, or the retractable door handles.

Is this why all the luxury manufacturers have recently stated, one way or another, that they're preparing Tesla fighters? I think so. It's insane.
